COVID-19

Though we hope we are on the other side of COVID affecting dance schedules, procedures and competitions, we are being realistic and will face the challenges as they come. Please be understanding and flexible as these decisions are not easy, but made with the dancers best interest in mind. Competitions will also have their own guidelines and procedures to follow.

Placement Auditions

All dancers interested in PAC are invited to join. We create companies based on dancers that we and the outside judges feel will work best together in rehearsals and performances, loosely based on age but majority based on ability and uniformity. By participating, you understand that the company placements are final. Dancers will not be moved within a company during a season, unless injury or unforeseen circumstances require that. Our decisions in creating companies this year, or any year, depends on our numbers, and how we think it is best to divide them up. No amount of speculation by staff, parents, or even dancers themselves can determine what will happen with our auditions each season.

Commitment & Expectations

The Competitive Dance Program at United Talent is a 12-month commitment, during which numerous events will take place. Confusion and frustration during the year can be avoided by understanding the commitment up front and taking an active role in the program.

Time Commitment

- Attend PAC rehearsal on Mondays, one Flex/Tech class and recreational leveled Ballet & Jazz classes each week
 - 5.5 hours of class requirement (6 hours due to longer ballet class for Levels IV and V)
 - Dancers must regularly attend their required recreational classes to remain in PAC program (*minimum* of 2 of out 4 per month)
- Can take any additional UT dance classes (jazz technique, tap, hip hop, musical theatre, lyrical/modern, acro, etc) as apart of \$165/month unlimited tuition
 - Consistent attendance for these classes is required to stay enrolled. Many of these classes have waitlists of recreational students that would love to be in class.

Dancer Expectations

- Be EARLY for classes, rehearsals & private lessons
 - Dancers should arrive 5 minutes early to classes, rehearsals & private lessons and stretch in the hallway while waiting. Punctuality is important!
- Regular & Consistent Attendance
 - Every dancer is expected to be in recreational classes & PAC rehearsals each week in order to keep up with skills & choreography. When one dancer is missing, it makes rehearsals the following week more difficult. If the dancer is ill/contagious, please have them stay home. If absent when PAC choreography is taught, it is the dancer's responsibility to learn what was missed before the next rehearsal.
 - **NEW:** Dancers that need to sit out of a rehearsal for mild illness or injury need to sit and take notes during the rehearsal. There is still learning that can be done from sitting out.
- Stay Informed
 - Even though parents are often times the main contact receiving emails, dancers should stay updated as well. Particularly for our older dancers if you would like to be added to the email distribution, let Ms. Cassidy know.
- Behavior
 - All dancers must be able to compromise, take constructive criticism gracefully, and adjust to times of stress for the benefit of PAC. Dancers must be cooperative and respectful to all teachers, fellow dancers, UT staff, parents, and competitive opponents. <u>Dancers should never correct to another dancer!</u> While seated and watching peers, it is great to give encouraging comments to your fellow dancers. Any disrespectful behavior will be handled by the teacher(s), and may result in sitting out, dismissal from rehearsal, parent-dancer-teacher conference, and/or removal from program.
- Follow Dress Code
 - PAC dancers are role models for the rest of UTD, and must follow the dress code set for each class/rehearsal. Dancers should have *one bag* with all shoes, extra leotards/tights, hair accessories (hair bands, bobby pins, etc). Please see Dress Code on website for more info. Items should be labeled with name/initials to avoid confusion.

Know Choreography & Practice Regularly

As a member of a competitive program, knowing your company routines & practicing them outside of scheduled rehearsals is a requirement. If a dancer falls behind, an instructor may require a private lesson for them to catch up. UTD can remove a dancer from a competition/performance if they are not well prepared, or if they have poor attendance or poor behavior. If absent when PAC choreography is taught, it is the dancer's responsibility to learn what was missed before the next rehearsal.

• Do Take Dance Seriously!

Of course, we want our dancers to have fun and learn while doing so. Remember the large time and financial commitments associated with this program. Specifically for our solos, duos, and trios—remember that groups are the priority, and the those opportunities can be taken away at any point in the season. COMPANY FIRST, SELF SECOND! Personal accountability is essential for a successful season, and commitment to your other company members is a vital component of this success.

Parent Expectations

• Stay Informed

Please make sure I have the email you want me to use for my PAC News emails. Subscribe to our remind 101 account: just text @utdpacvis to 81010. Remind 101 is used specifically for competition weekends. We have a United Talent PAC Facebook group page, but IS NOT the primary way of contact. If you need to contact me, please use my email: cassidy@unitedtalentky.com My cell phone (859-608-4545) is for emergencies only!

Keep an Updated Calendar

It is not that we mind answering questions concerning information already provided, but this will help eliminate those questions. As new deadlines & rehearsals are added, please also add them to your personal calendar.

• Ask Questions that Pertain to your Dancer

These types of questions are invited and allow you to expand your knowledge of dance! Remember that most gossip & rumors come from people who are misinformed. Please email an instructor to schedule a meeting or phone conference. DO NOT discipline a child other than your own. Teachers cannot and will not answer questions that pertain to another dancer/group.

• Trust the UTD Staff

Please do not contact an instructor (or gossip with other parents) regarding dancer's company placement, song/costume choices, or choreography. Faith in the instructors must come first! These types of discussions are selfish and individualistic. Overreaching questions will not be answered - this includes topics such as idea suggesting, scheduling, competition info, and speculating on future plans for PAC. We will share information as we see pertinent.

Building Behavior

Unlike our recreational classes, there are not set weeks for PAC Rehearsal observation. When coming into the building to drop off and pick up dancers, please do not engage in gossip. To coordinate observation for private lessons, please discuss with specific instructor.

• Encourage your Dancer

Allow the teachers to give dance related corrections and be tough on them in the studios/at competitions. Always be the one to build your child up and support them! <u>Giving your dancer incorrect critiques related to their dance technique/performance can be detrimental to their training. Again, please trust that the UTD Staff is well-trained and has your dancer's best interest in mind.</u>

Parent/Teacher Communication

A meeting can be arranged, by appointment, with an instructor if you have questions or concerns about your child's class or progress. Please email to schedule any appointments or phone conferences. Do not try to discuss matters with the instructor before/after pickup. By doing so you will not be getting the full attention you deserve from the instructor, and you could be causing the next class to start late. Please make arrangements for a more private meeting, or send an email when possible.

Please keep all calls & text messages related to **urgent topics or emergencies**. Whenever possible call the studio & leave a message: 502-863-1002. Social Media messengers (Facebook, Instagram, etc.) are not a reliable form of communication for staff.

Estimated Costs & Due Dates

- 1. Competition Entry Fees—due dates separate for each competition
 - Will run credit cards on those dates for full competition amount
 - Any YAGP solos, photogenic entries, etc. that dancers would like to enter will be charged on the same dates
 - If you prefer to pay check or cash, you must do so **BEFORE** the due date
- **2. Choreography Fees**—due by September 27th (cash or check to UT)
 - \$50 per routine (no fee for Production choreography)
 - Petite Company \$50, Junior & Apprentice Companies \$100, Teen Company \$150, Senior Company \$200, plus \$50 for tap routines
 - \$150 solo, \$125 duo per dancer, \$100 for trio per dancer (due at time of choreography session)
- 3. Costume Fees—approx. \$80-115 per dance, processed via credit card on October 18th
 - Specific price per routine coming in early October
- 4. Warm-up Jacket—The dancers must UTD apparel on stage for awards (preferably a jacket, old or new). We have a new jacket design coming this year with our new UT Performing Arts Company logo!
- 5. Directors Fee—\$100 per dancer, processed via credit card January 17th
- 6. Rhinestones—subject to specific costume needs and ordered in December-February
- 7. Costume Size Exchanges/Alterations—approx. \$10-25 per dancer (due in March)
 - When group costumes arrive, they will all be altered by our volunteer moms.
 - Please let Ms. Cassidy know if you're proficient in sewing and would like to be added to our alterations team.
- 8. **Guest Teacher Fee:** We are working out the details of having Ms. Ellen Werksman of Chicago's Dancewerks come back to us for a workshop this season. We typically do this on a non-Nationals season. <u>Cost & due dates TBD.</u> For reference, in 2019-2020 season, it was \$165 per dancer. Optional participation this season.
- 9. **Re-Blocking Fee:** if your dancer quits PAC or must miss a competition, we are now charging a reblocking fee to cover the choreographers time and effort. Dancers that must drop due to injury are excused from this fee, provided that a Doctor's note warrants them pulling out. \$75 per routine

Dress Code, Shoes & Accessories

if you can hold off on buying new shoes and tights until we announce specifics for each costume, that would be the smartest financially!

Dress Code for PAC rehearsals, both Mondays & Weekends: Black Leotard, Black jazz shorts, Pink/Tan/Black Tights, Proper Shoes & Hair UP!!

Tights, Earrings, Hair & Makeup

• Information for tights will be announced around Dress Rehearsal time. Note: I will often use "tan" to abbreviate tight color, though it is actually **Capezio Caramel**. The specific tight style will depend on costume.

- We are using the same earrings as previous years, 20mm Crystal AB Earrings (pierced or clip-on). I will place an order in January for anyone that needs them (\$10/pair).
- <u>No extra piercings</u> should be worn on stage, including but not limited to: 2nd+ ear lobe, ear cartilage, nose, belly button.
- Any tattoos should be covered with skin-toned makeup during performances.
- Dancers will have assigned hairstyles and makeup styles to wear at competition. Dancers will abide by the set requirements. Be prepared that short hair will have to be pulled out of the face.
- Dancers may not have colored nails during a performance. Please plan accordingly with school dances, cotillions, proms, etc.

Solo, Duo & Trio Auditions

For solos, we are looking for confident performers that can remember choreography on their own, have solid technical foundation and are committed to putting in extra hours of work. Dancers must audition for their first and second years of a solo. After that, they automatically receive that opportunity each following year.

For duos and trios, all that are interested should mark so on their audition registration. We put together pairings that dance similarly and compliment each other. Dancers and parents cannot choose who gets paired together. If you choose to deny a duo/trio placement, you will also forfeit your placement within all of PAC for this season.

Solo, Duo & Trio Private Lessons

\$1/minute = \$30 solo, \$15 duo per dancer, \$10 trio per dancer (based on 30 min lesson)

Payment — Private lessons need to be paid separately from your tuition (exact cash or check only, with teacher's name written) and put in payment box* or given to the instructor.

*New Payment Box on the dance side was installed over the weekend!

Scheduling — Please check with your dancer's choreographer for scheduling. Every teacher handles this differently.

• Studio availability is tight and the peak hours of 4pm-8pm are difficult to fit private lessons in. Please be understanding that lessons may be scheduled late at night, on weekends, etc.

Duos/Trios — If your dancer is in a duo/trio, its your responsibility to communicate with each other with scheduling lessons. Please go ahead and get their contact information!

Please note that available studio time & space is extremely limited, and private lessons should be taken seriously. If your dancer is ill or unable to attend the lesson, you must contact the instructor as early as possible to inform us. If the teacher is at the studio waiting on the dancer, it is too late and you WILL be charged as a NO SHOW! Less than 24 hour notice for a cancellation will be treated like a NO SHOW and charged accordingly.

Other Private Lessons

We will also schedule private lessons to work on company routine choreography with individuals or for technique work. The rate is also \$1 per minute. We are more than willing to schedule extra private lessons with your dancer at your request, but time and space are limited.

Please email Ms. Cassidy (or specific/requested instructor) to schedule any additional private lessons throughout the season!

To participate in private lessons, the dancer must be in "good standing" financially

PAC Rehearsal Attendance Policy

Competitive dance, like most sports, requires frequent and focused rehearsal in order to be successful. With that being said, we understand that dance is not the ONLY activity that our members may choose to participate in. We encourage them to try all different types of activities "recreationally" during their young lives. However, we feel that when you make a commitment to a "competitive" program in one of those activities, such as our PAC program here at UTD, it is not a decision to be taken lightly. The dancer's attendance & attitude will affect the whole company. While we do not ask that you solely dedicate your lives to our program, we do require that you make dance at UTD a priority.

Excused Absences (Teachers should be notified before absence!)

- Medical absences (contagious illness, COVID, quarantine, etc.)
- Educational school related absences (BETA, DECA, Band/Chorus, etc)
- Infrequent church related activities or trips
- Death/terminal illness of immediate family member

Unexcused Absences - 3 UNEXCUSED absences from rehearsals will result in a parent/teacher conference & discussion about participation in upcoming performances. This will be discussed and handled on a case by case basis.

- Injury or Mild Illness (headache, cramps, etc.)
- Other Extracurricular Team practices/performances/games
- School related issues (detention, homework/projects)
- Skipping rehearsal for birthday parties, friend events, or "didn't feel like coming"

Excused Absences for Competitions

Please take into consideration that when a dancer is removed for a competition that it causes our instructors and other dancers to re-work each routine. There will be re-blocking fee charged to accommodate those changes. Please let Ms. Cassidy know ASAP if your dancer cannot attend. Depending on the time frame and how close the missed competition is to other events, dancers may not be able to compete at other events.

- Mandatory School Performances for a grade (ie., Dance SCAPA, Band/Choir Concerts)
- Extreme Illness of dancers
- Weddings or Funerals of close family members

COMPETITION DO'S & DON'TS

We will have a meeting prior to each competition. We will discuss specific details and the weekend schedule at that time.

DO: Arrive at Competitions early to familiarize yourself with the venue. Dancers **must** be dressed & ready to dance 1 hour prior to performance time.

DO: Take the time to attend at least one other performance at each Competition. We need lots of support in the audience!

DO: Stay for each awards ceremony in which your company/solo/duo/trio competed.

DO: Wear lots of Pink & Green/UT Gear! This is a requirement for dancers during awards ceremonies. We have a partnership with Our Merch Store for all apparel with UT logo or name.

DO: Double check that all costume pieces/accessories have made the trip. Use a checklist before you leave home, and check again when arriving at venue.

DO: Follow all hair and makeup requirements!

DO: Pack healthy snacks, waters, and emergency items. Come prepared with routine music, headphones/speaker, and anything else you may need to fully prepare!

DO: Volunteer (parents) to help transport props, drive prop truck, etc. The instructors cannot do this alone!

DON'T: Text any instructors to ask how the competition is running. Please rely on other parents for that information if you have left the venue.

DON'T: Hang out backstage, unless helping with props! Dancers are only allowed backstage 10 numbers before they perform.

DON'T: Spread drama or rumors! Competitions should be a positive experience for dancers and families alike. Any concerns should be brought directly to Ms. Cassidy, preferably via email unless urgent.

DON'T: Speak negatively of another routine, studio, costume, songs, etc. You never know who is listening, and while at competition everyone represents UTD! Keep all comments positive and encouraging!
